


Lavender Pendibules

Single Fabric Tutorial


1. Each pendibule is made from a square of fabric. You can change the size of your pendibule by altering the size of your original square. If you've never made one before, I suggest you cut your square, no smaller than 4 ½". You then need to fold it in half diagonally, right sides together.



2. Stitch the first side towards the folded edge using a ¼" seam allowance.



3. Repeat the same for the second side, leaving a gap of about 1" in the centre of the seam to allow for turning.



4. Snip the corner from the stitched point to allow for a neat point, and then turn your triangle right side out.



5. Stuff your pendibule with dried lavender. A funnel may make this process easier for you. Make sure you don't over fill your pendibule as you will need some room to be able to shape it into the correct shape.



6. Thread a needle with matching thread and hand sew the opening closed with an invisible stitch.



7. We now have to shape our pendibule. With a double thread, you need to fold to the centre the corner points (either end of the folded edge) and stitch the points together. Conceal the starting knot between the two points and stitch through all layers about three or four times before finishing with a knot and trimming the thread.



8. Now your pendibule is ready for the ribbon hanging loop and bow. This will conceal the join and give you a lovely finish. You need a length of ribbon around 75cms long. The width of your ribbon will depend on the size of your pendibule, narrow ribbon for small one and wider for the larger ones.

Start by folding the ribbon in half and form a loop. Hold it against the join in the pendibule, fold the two ends under, cross over and then back over the top, making sure one tail end goes either side of the loop.



Tie a knot and then repeat taking the ends under and back over. Tie a knot and then a bow. You will then have a hanging loop with bow. Trim the ends of the ribbon diagonally to prevent fraying.



**You have now completed your pendibule, place in a drawer or hang it in your wardrobe.
To make a two fabric pendibule, follow the instructions below.**



Two Fabric Pendibule


1. Cut two pieces of contrasting/complimentary of fabric, 5 ½" square (you can adjust the size of your pendibules at this state, do remember to allow for the extra seam allowance).



2. With a ruler, mark a line from corner to corner. This will be the cutting line, so any pen or pencil will do.



3. Stitch ¼" either side of the marked line.



4. Cut along the line, you can use ruler and rotary cutter, or a pair of scissors. You will end up with two triangles with a different fabric either side.



5. Now follow the instructions given for the one fabric pendibule. Each triangle will give one pendibule.
